Professional Criminal Justice Associations:

Vermont Association of Court Diversion Programs (VACDP): Member association of Vermont's 14 court diversion programs.

Vermont Crime Research Center (CRGVT): Provides evaluation services, analyzes crime trends, conducts crime analysis, and responds to data requests from justice partners.



American Society of Criminology (ASC): International organization focusing on measurement, etiology, consequences, prevention, control, and treatment of crime and delinquency.

International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP): Oldest and largest nonprofit membership organization of police executives.

American Probation & Parole Association (APPA): Actively involved with probation, parole, and community-based corrections in adult and juvenile sectors.

American Bar Association (ABA): Provides law school accreditation, continuing legal education, law information, programs to assist lawyers and judges in their work, and initiatives to improve the legal system.

Society for Police & Criminal Psychology (SPCP): Encourages the scientific study of police and criminal psychology as applied to problems in criminal justice.

American Jail Association (AJA): National group focused on supporting local correctional facilities and professionals who operate them.

American Academy of Forensic Science (AAFS): Advances science and its application to the legal system, encouraging collaboration in the forensic sciences.

International Association for Identification (IAI): World's oldest and largest organization of forensic identification investigators, examiners, analysts, and technicians.

American Society for Industrial Security International (ASIS): Largest international organization for security professionals.

International Association of Women Police (IAWP): Strives to ensure equity for women in criminal justice.

International Community Corrections Association (ICCA): Promotes community-based criminal justice and alternative services.

National Association of Blacks in Criminal Justice (NABCJ): Multi-ethnic, non-partisan, non-profit association dedicated to improving the administration of justice.

National Organization for Victim Assistance (NOVA): Promotes rights and services for victims of crime/crisis through advocacy, direct services, and assistance to professional colleagues.

National Sheriffs' Association (NSA): Dedicated to raising the level of professionalism in the criminal justice field through research, education, and training.
