The purpose of the articulation agreement with VLS is to guarantee admission into Vermont Law School's J.D. or Joint J.D./M.S.E.L. degree program to Champlain College students who successfully complete Champlain's requirements for the bachelor's degree (BA or BS) and who also meet the following entrance requirements:

- The applicant has completed 60 credits towards the bachelor's degree with a GPA calculated by LSDAS that is equal to or exceeds the average GPA of the first-year J.D. class in residents at VLS at the time of the Champlain student's application to VLS (currently around 3.22)
- The applicant has a current LSAT score (dated less than four years from the first semester of enrollment at VLS) that is equal to or exceeds the average LSAT score of the first-year J.D. class in residence at VLS at the time of the Champlain student's application to VLS (currently around 155)
- The applicant presents two letters of recommendation from Champlain College faculty, one of which is from the applicant's major field of study
- The applicant's file, from his/her tenure at Champlain and any other academic institution from which credits were earned and/or applied toward the Champlain degree, contains no evidence of character or fitness concerns that would generally disqualify the applicant from admission into Vermont Law.

The Clarkson MBA program places special emphasis on developing leadership, entrepreneurial, and managerial abilities, in addition to teaching the skills that are required for success in the business world; teamwork is a central focus. Recent graduates of this MBA program have accepted positions in marketing, finance, information systems, operations management, human resources, and consulting in both small and large firms in the United States and Canada.

- **Required Foundation Courses to be taken at Champlain:** Financial Accounting, Managerial Accounting, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Financial Management I & II, Production/Operations Management, Statistics & Quantitative Methods, Business Law, Management and Organizational Behavior, Marketing.

- General Requirements: All Champlain College foundation courses must be completed with a grade of 'C' or better. All applicants are assumed to have a working knowledge of Calculus, from either high school or college coursework. Applicants must receive a GMAT score above the 50th percentile and have a 3.0 GPA for their junior and senior years. Students must submit an application and be reviewed for admission by the Admissions Committee at Clarkson.

The MBA program is designed to prepare students for middle management and senior management positions. - Required Foundation Courses to be taken at Champlain: Financial Accounting and/or Managerial Accounting, Microeconomics/Macroeconomics, Business Law I, Introduction to Statistics, College Algebra and Algebra & Trigonometry or College Algebra and Math in Accounting & Finance or Calculus I.
- General Requirements: Students must have an undergraduate cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better. All foundation courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Champlain students who have met the admissions requirements (overall cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a 2.0 GPA in the required foundation courses) are offered unconditional admission to SNHU. They do not have to take the GMAT's.
