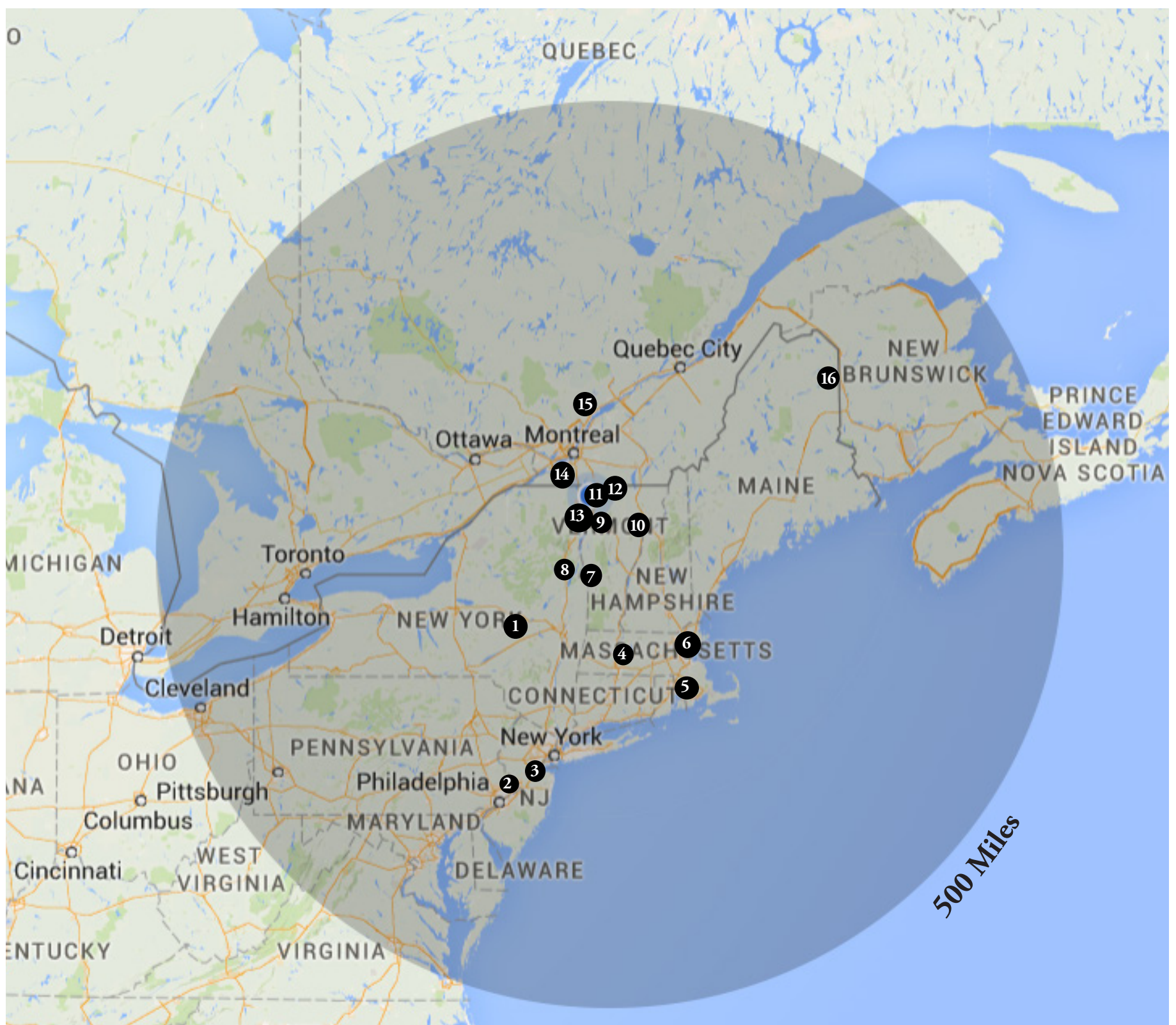




What Is Perry Hall Made Of?

Deconstructing the Construction of Perry Hall

More than **38%** of materials used in the construction of Perry Hall, as a percentage of total cost, were harvested and manufactured with **500 miles** of Burlington. The original construction materials in this 145-year-old structure include slate, copper, stone, and brick. The high quality of these materials allowed **84%** of the existing wall, floor, and roof elements to be maintained. This project also diverted **76%** of worksite-generated construction waste from the landfill. Almost **23%** of the materials used in the construction, as a percentage of total cost, were recycled. **55%** of the total wood-based building materials were harvested from Forest Stewardship Council-certified forests. The local and recycled materials used in Perry Hall have helped to reduce its carbon footprint, while also supporting local economies.
